

Appendix 1: Results of children's survey

Overview

Children are important users of Wimbledon Park. Recognising that children are less likely to take part in formal consultation activity, Merton Council engaged separately with children who use Wimbledon Park as part of the consultation on options that took place between 3 July 2016 to 22 August 2016. This appendix sets out the results of this engagement.

Methodology

Merton Council sought the views of children who use Wimbledon Park through a survey conducted in the Park during the consultation period. The objective of the survey was to help Merton Council understand children's priorities for the future. Responses were collected by Merton Council consultation team members using iPads over a range of dates and times during the consultation period.

The survey consisted of a number of optional questions, designed to help Merton Council understand how children use the Park and what their priorities are for its future. PPS Group has analysed the results of the survey on behalf of Merton Council.

This survey was conducted to supplement consultation on masterplan options for Wimbledon Park and should not be read outside of this context.

Results

47 responses to the survey were received in total.

Q1. What's your favourite thing about coming to the Park?

This question asked respondents about their favourite thing about coming to the Park. Its intention was to understand what children most value about the Park. The question welcomed open comments, and respondents were invited to list as many aspects of the Park as they wished. 46 children answered this question.






