  - (b) there would be no charge for parking in the parking places.

The Council of the London Borough of Merton, having consulted the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended by section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985(b), Part 6 and Schedules 7 to 12 of the Traffic Management Act 2004(c) and of all other enabling powers hereby make the following Order:-

#### PART I

#### **PRELIMINARY**

#### Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Merton (Free Parking Places) (Mawson Close) Order 2021 and shall come into force on 28 June 2021.

#### Revocation

2. N/A.

#### Interpretation

3. (1) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires:-

"civil enforcement officer" has the same meaning as in the Traffic Management Act 2004 and means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise and enforce the provisions of this Order:

"Council" means the Council of the London Borough of Merton;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meanings as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000(d);

"driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;

"electronic communications network" has the same meaning as in the Communications Act 2003(e).

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public, general or local, and includes any Order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment and any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment;

"goods carrying vehicle" means a motor vehicle which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description and is not drawing a trailer;

"motorcycle" has the same meaning as in section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

"parking place" means any area on a highway designated as a parking place by this Order;

"parking space" means a space in a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle;

"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle) constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of not more than twelve passengers (exclusive of the driver) and their effects and not drawing a trailer;

"penalty charge" has the same meaning as that given in section 92 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 in respect of a contravention of a provision to this Order;

"permitted hours" in relation to a parking place means the period specified at the beginning of the Schedule relating to that parking place;

"Schedule" means a Schedule to this Order;

"street" includes part of a street;

- (2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed as a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- (3) The prohibitions imposed by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any other enactment and any exception or exemption from the provisions of this Order is without prejudice to the provisions of any other enactment.

#### **PART II**

#### **DESIGNATION OF PARKING PLACES**

#### **Designation of parking places**

4. Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column 2 of a Schedule to this Order and, unless otherwise so specified, bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 2.0 metres is designated as a parking place.

#### Number and situation of parking spaces

5. The number of parking spaces in each parking place referred to in column 2 of a Schedule to this Order shall not exceed the number specified in relation thereto in column 3 of that Schedule and the number and situation of such parking spaces in each parking place shall be as may be determined by the Council.

#### Vehicles for which parking places are designated

6. Each parking place referred to in a Schedule to this Order may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, during the permitted hours for the leaving of passenger vehicles, goods vehicles, motor cycles and vehicles displaying a disabled person's badge.

#### PART III

#### SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS

#### Period for which a vehicle may be left in a parking place

7. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be left in a parking place in a Schedule to this Order during the permitted hours for a continuous period longer than the maximum period of waiting specified in the heading to that Schedule and no person may cause or permit that same vehicle to return to that same parking place during the permitted hours, until the expiry of the minimum period specified in the heading to that Schedule of that parking place, beginning from the time it was driven away after the previous period of waiting in that same parking place.

#### **Contraventions in parking places**

- 8. A contravention of this Order and a parking contravention within Part 1 of Schedule 7 to the Traffic Management Act 2004 shall occur and a penalty charge will be payable if:
  - (a) during the permitted hours, a vehicle is left in a parking place designated in a Schedule to this Order for a period longer than the maximum period of waiting specified in the heading to that Schedule; or
  - (b) during the permitted hours, the same vehicle is returned to the same parking place before the expiry of the minimum period specified in the heading to the Schedule to that parking place; or
  - (c) the vehicle is left parked in a manner that does not comply with that prescribed in Article 9.

#### Manner of standing in a parking place

- 9. Every vehicle left in a parking place in accordance with the foregoing provisions of the Order shall so stand;
  - (a) in the case of a parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are specified in Column 4 of a Schedule to this Order, as to be in accordance with those provisions;
  - (b) in the case of any other parking place, if the parking place is not in a one-way street, that the left hand or near-side of the vehicle is adjacent to the left-hand edge of the carriageway;
  - (c) that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a parking place; and
  - (d) that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting.

For the purposes of the last foregoing sub-paragraph, the expression "premises" shall not include any premises to or from which goods are being delivered or collected.

#### Power to suspend the use of a parking place

- 10. (1) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:
  - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
  - (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation adjacent to the parking place, the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to the parking place, the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any

- electronic communications network or the placing, maintenance of removal of any traffic sign;
- (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the parking place from or to a depository, another office of dwellinghouse;
- (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
- (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals, or on any other special occasions; or
- (f) for filming purposes.
- (2) A police constable in uniform may suspend for not more than seven days the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
- (3) On the suspension of the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Article, the person authorising or causing such suspension shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof, as the case may be, traffic signs indicating that the waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
- (4) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in a parking place or any part thereof at any time during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or that thereof, as the case may be, a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article:

Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall apply:

- (i) in respect of any vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 11(1)(b) or (d); or
- (ii) to anything done with the permission of the person suspending the use of the parking place or part thereof or a police constable in uniform or a police community support officer in uniform.

#### Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in a parking place

- 11. (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours in any part of a parking place if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:
  - (a) the vehicle is waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes, or such longer period as a civil enforcement officer may approve, to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage:
    - provided that if the said person is a person suffering from any disability or injury which seriously impairs his ability to walk or who is blind, the vehicle may wait for as long as may be necessary to enable that person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage:
  - (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
  - (c) the vehicle is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes or is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers

- or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the parking place in which it is waiting:
- (d) the vehicle is waiting only for as long as may be necessary to enable it to be used on connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic.
- (2) Except as provided by this Order, the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a parking place.

#### **Exemptions**

- 12. (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provision of this Order a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority may be left in a parking space without time limit, provided that the use of that part of the parking space in which the vehicle is left has not been suspended.
  - (2) A vehicle to which this Article applies shall stand in a parking space in accordance with the provisions of sub-paragraphs (a), (b) or (d) of Article 9 of this Order and wholly within the limits of that parking space.

#### Movement of a vehicle in a parking place in an emergency

13. A police constable in uniform, a police community support officer in uniform, a traffic warden or a civil enforcement officer may move or cause to be moved, in case of emergency, to any place they think fit, any vehicle which is left unattended in a parking place.

#### Alteration of position of a vehicle in a parking place

14. Where any vehicle is standing in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 9, a civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions.

#### Removal of a vehicle from a parking place

15. Where a civil enforcement officer is of the opinion that any of the provisions contained in Article 9 have been contravened or not complied with in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place then he may remove or cause to be removed the vehicle from the parking place and, where it is so removed, shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle.

#### Placing of traffic signs

- 16. The Council shall:
  - (a) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place traffic signs and or carriageway markings of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised by the Department of Transport indicating that such parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the purpose and leaving only of the vehicles specified in Article 6 and for the period specified in Article 7; and
  - (b) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purpose of the satisfactory operation of a parking place.

  - (c) the waiting restrictions in Morden Road, Mitcham, on the north-side in the vicinity of the Surrey Arms, will be updated to match the existing road layout;
  - (d) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle for 40 minutes) will be prohibited at between 8.30am and 12 noon on Mondays in Morden Road, Mitcham, the north side, from the western boundary of "White Cottage", Morden Road westward for a distance of 12 metres.

The Council of the London Borough of Merton, having consulted the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended by section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985(b), Part 6 and Schedules 7 to 12 of the Traffic Management Act 2004(c) and of all other enabling powers hereby make the following Order:-

#### PART I

#### **PRELIMINARY**

#### Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Merton (Free Parking Places) (Mawson Close) Order 202\* and shall come into force on \* 202\*.

#### Revocation

2. N/A.

#### Interpretation

3. (1) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires:-

"civil enforcement officer" has the same meaning as in the Traffic Management Act 2004 and means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise and enforce the provisions of this Order:

"Council" means the Council of the London Borough of Merton;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meanings as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000(d);

"driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;

"electronic communications network" has the same meaning as in the Communications Act 2003(e).

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public, general or local, and includes any Order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment and any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment;

"goods carrying vehicle" means a motor vehicle which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description and is not drawing a trailer;

"motorcycle" has the same meaning as in section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

"parking place" means any area on a highway designated as a parking place by this Order;

"parking space" means a space in a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle;

"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle) constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of not more than twelve passengers (exclusive of the driver) and their effects and not drawing a trailer;

"penalty charge" has the same meaning as that given in section 92 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 in respect of a contravention of a provision to this Order;

"permitted hours" in relation to a parking place means the period specified at the beginning of the Schedule relating to that parking place;

"Schedule" means a Schedule to this Order;

"street" includes part of a street;

- (2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed as a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- (3) The prohibitions imposed by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any other enactment and any exception or exemption from the provisions of this Order is without prejudice to the provisions of any other enactment.

#### **PART II**

#### **DESIGNATION OF PARKING PLACES**

#### **Designation of parking places**

4. Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column 2 of a Schedule to this Order and, unless otherwise so specified, bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 2.0 metres is designated as a parking place.

#### Number and situation of parking spaces

5. The number of parking spaces in each parking place referred to in column 2 of a Schedule to this Order shall not exceed the number specified in relation thereto in column 3 of that Schedule and the number and situation of such parking spaces in each parking place shall be as may be determined by the Council.

#### Vehicles for which parking places are designated

6. Each parking place referred to in a Schedule to this Order may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, during the permitted hours for the leaving of passenger vehicles, goods vehicles, motor cycles and vehicles displaying a disabled person's badge.

#### PART III

#### SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS

#### Period for which a vehicle may be left in a parking place

7. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be left in a parking place in a Schedule to this Order during the permitted hours for a continuous period longer than the maximum period of waiting specified in the heading to that Schedule and no person may cause or permit that same vehicle to return to that same parking place during the permitted hours, until the expiry of the minimum period specified in the heading to that Schedule of that parking place, beginning from the time it was driven away after the previous period of waiting in that same parking place.

#### **Contraventions in parking places**

- 8. A contravention of this Order and a parking contravention within Part 1 of Schedule 7 to the Traffic Management Act 2004 shall occur and a penalty charge will be payable if:
  - (a) during the permitted hours, a vehicle is left in a parking place designated in a Schedule to this Order for a period longer than the maximum period of waiting specified in the heading to that Schedule; or
  - (b) during the permitted hours, the same vehicle is returned to the same parking place before the expiry of the minimum period specified in the heading to the Schedule to that parking place; or
  - (c) the vehicle is left parked in a manner that does not comply with that prescribed in Article 9.

#### Manner of standing in a parking place

- 9. Every vehicle left in a parking place in accordance with the foregoing provisions of the Order shall so stand;
  - (a) in the case of a parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are specified in Column 4 of a Schedule to this Order, as to be in accordance with those provisions;
  - (b) in the case of any other parking place, if the parking place is not in a one-way street, that the left hand or near-side of the vehicle is adjacent to the left-hand edge of the carriageway;
  - (c) that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a parking place; and
  - (d) that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting.

For the purposes of the last foregoing sub-paragraph, the expression "premises" shall not include any premises to or from which goods are being delivered or collected.

#### Power to suspend the use of a parking place

- 10. (1) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:
  - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
  - (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation adjacent to the parking place, the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to the parking place, the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any

- electronic communications network or the placing, maintenance of removal of any traffic sign;
- (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the parking place from or to a depository, another office of dwellinghouse;
- (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
- (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals, or on any other special occasions; or
- (f) for filming purposes.
- (2) A police constable in uniform may suspend for not more than seven days the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
- (3) On the suspension of the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Article, the person authorising or causing such suspension shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof, as the case may be, traffic signs indicating that the waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
- (4) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in a parking place or any part thereof at any time during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or that thereof, as the case may be, a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article:

Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall apply:

- (i) in respect of any vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 11(1)(b) or (d); or
- (ii) to anything done with the permission of the person suspending the use of the parking place or part thereof or a police constable in uniform or a police community support officer in uniform.

#### Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in a parking place

- 11. (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours in any part of a parking place if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:
  - (a) the vehicle is waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes, or such longer period as a civil enforcement officer may approve, to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage:
    - provided that if the said person is a person suffering from any disability or injury which seriously impairs his ability to walk or who is blind, the vehicle may wait for as long as may be necessary to enable that person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage:
  - (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
  - (c) the vehicle is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes or is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers

- or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the parking place in which it is waiting;
- (d) the vehicle is waiting only for as long as may be necessary to enable it to be used on connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic.
- (2) Except as provided by this Order, the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a parking place.

#### **Exemptions**

- 12. (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provision of this Order a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority may be left in a parking space without time limit, provided that the use of that part of the parking space in which the vehicle is left has not been suspended.
  - (2) A vehicle to which this Article applies shall stand in a parking space in accordance with the provisions of sub-paragraphs (a), (b) or (d) of Article 9 of this Order and wholly within the limits of that parking space.

#### Movement of a vehicle in a parking place in an emergency

13. A police constable in uniform, a police community support officer in uniform, a traffic warden or a civil enforcement officer may move or cause to be moved, in case of emergency, to any place they think fit, any vehicle which is left unattended in a parking place.

#### Alteration of position of a vehicle in a parking place

14. Where any vehicle is standing in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 9, a civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions.

#### Removal of a vehicle from a parking place

15. Where a civil enforcement officer is of the opinion that any of the provisions contained in Article 9 have been contravened or not complied with in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place then he may remove or cause to be removed the vehicle from the parking place and, where it is so removed, shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle.

#### Placing of traffic signs

- 16. The Council shall:
  - (a) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place traffic signs and or carriageway markings of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised by the Department of Transport indicating that such parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the purpose and leaving only of the vehicles specified in Article 6 and for the period specified in Article 7; and
  - (b) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purpose of the satisfactory operation of a parking place.

#### **PRELIMINARY**

#### Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Merton (Free Parking Places) (Martin Way) Order 2021 and shall come into force on 7June 2021.

#### Revocation

## Interpretation

3. (1) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires:-

"civil enforcement officer" has the same meaning as in the Traffic Management Act 2004 and means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise and enforce the provisions of this Order:

"Council" means the Council of the London Borough of Merton;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meanings as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000(d);

"driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;

"electronic communications network" has the same meaning as in the Communications Act 2003(e).

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public, general or local, and includes any Order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment and any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment;

"goods carrying vehicle" means a motor vehicle which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description and is not drawing a trailer;

"motorcycle" has the same meaning as in section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

"parking place" means any area on a highway designated as a parking place by this Order;

"parking space" means a space in a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle;

"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle) constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of not more than twelve passengers (exclusive of the driver) and their effects and not drawing a trailer;

"penalty charge" has the same meaning as that given in section 92 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 in respect of a contravention of a provision to this Order;

"permitted hours" in relation to a parking place means the period specified at the beginning of the Schedule relating to that parking place;

"Schedule" means a Schedule to this Order;

"street" includes part of a street;

- (2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed as a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- (3) The prohibitions imposed by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any other enactment and any exception or exemption from the provisions of this Order is without prejudice to the provisions of any other enactment.

#### **PART II**

## **DESIGNATION OF PARKING PLACES**

## **Designation of parking places**

4. Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column 2 of a Schedule to this Order and, unless otherwise so specified, bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 2.0 metres is designated as a parking place.

## Number and situation of parking spaces

5. The number of parking spaces in each parking place referred to in column 2 of a Schedule to this Order shall not exceed the number specified in relation thereto in column 3 of that Schedule and the number and situation of such parking spaces in each parking place shall be as may be determined by the Council.

## Vehicles for which parking places are designated

6. Each parking place referred to in a Schedule to this Order may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, during the permitted hours for the leaving of passenger vehicles, goods vehicles, motor cycles and vehicles displaying a disabled person's badge.

#### PART III

#### SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS

## Period for which a vehicle may be left in a parking place

7. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be left in a parking place in a Schedule to this Order during the permitted hours for a continuous period longer than the maximum period of waiting specified in the heading to that Schedule and no person may cause or permit that same vehicle to return to that same parking place during the permitted hours, until the expiry of the minimum period specified in the heading to that Schedule of that parking place, beginning from the time it was driven away after the previous period of waiting in that same parking place.

## **Contraventions in parking places**

- 8. A contravention of this Order and a parking contravention within Part 1 of Schedule 7 to the Traffic Management Act 2004 shall occur and a penalty charge will be payable if:
  - (a) during the permitted hours, a vehicle is left in a parking place designated in a Schedule to this Order for a period longer than the maximum period of waiting specified in the heading to that Schedule; or
  - (b) during the permitted hours, the same vehicle is returned to the same parking place before the expiry of the minimum period specified in the heading to the Schedule to that parking place; or
  - (c) the vehicle is left parked in a manner that does not comply with that prescribed in Article 9.

## Manner of standing in a parking place

- 9. Every vehicle left in a parking place in accordance with the foregoing provisions of the Order shall so stand;
  - (a) in the case of a parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are specified in Column 4 of a Schedule to this Order, as to be in accordance with those provisions;
  - (b) in the case of any other parking place, if the parking place is not in a one-way street, that the left hand or near-side of the vehicle is adjacent to the left-hand edge of the carriageway;
  - (c) that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a parking place; and
  - (d) that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting.

For the purposes of the last foregoing sub-paragraph, the expression "premises" shall not include any premises to or from which goods are being delivered or collected.

# Power to suspend the use of a parking place

- 10. (1) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:
  - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
  - (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation adjacent to the parking place, the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to the parking place, the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any

- electronic communications network or the placing, maintenance of removal of any traffic sign;
- (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the parking place from or to a depository, another office of dwellinghouse;
- (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
- (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals, or on any other special occasions; or
- (f) for filming purposes.
- (2) A police constable in uniform may suspend for not more than seven days the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
- (3) On the suspension of the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Article, the person authorising or causing such suspension shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof, as the case may be, traffic signs indicating that the waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
- (4) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in a parking place or any part thereof at any time during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or that thereof, as the case may be, a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article:

Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall apply:

- (i) in respect of any vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 11(1)(b) or (d); or
- (ii) to anything done with the permission of the person suspending the use of the parking place or part thereof or a police constable in uniform or a police community support officer in uniform.

## Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in a parking place

- 11. (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours in any part of a parking place if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:
  - (a) the vehicle is waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes, or such longer period as a civil enforcement officer may approve, to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage:
    - provided that if the said person is a person suffering from any disability or injury which seriously impairs his ability to walk or who is blind, the vehicle may wait for as long as may be necessary to enable that person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage:
  - the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
  - (c) the vehicle is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes or is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers

- or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the parking place in which it is waiting;
- (d) the vehicle is waiting only for as long as may be necessary to enable it to be used on connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic.
- (2) Except as provided by this Order, the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a parking place.

## **Exemptions**

- 12. (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provision of this Order a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority may be left in a parking space without time limit, provided that the use of that part of the parking space in which the vehicle is left has not been suspended.
  - (2) A vehicle to which this Article applies shall stand in a parking space in accordance with the provisions of sub-paragraphs (a), (b) or (d) of Article 9 of this Order and wholly within the limits of that parking space.

## Movement of a vehicle in a parking place in an emergency

13. A police constable in uniform, a police community support officer in uniform, a traffic warden or a civil enforcement officer may move or cause to be moved, in case of emergency, to any place they think fit, any vehicle which is left unattended in a parking place.

## Alteration of position of a vehicle in a parking place

14. Where any vehicle is standing in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 9, a civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions.

## Removal of a vehicle from a parking place

15. Where a civil enforcement officer is of the opinion that any of the provisions contained in Article 9 have been contravened or not complied with in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place then he may remove or cause to be removed the vehicle from the parking place and, where it is so removed, shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle.

## Placing of traffic signs

- 16. The Council shall:
  - (a) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place traffic signs and or carriageway markings of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised by the Department of Transport indicating that such parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the purpose and leaving only of the vehicles specified in Article 6 and for the period specified in Article 7; and
  - (b) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purpose of the satisfactory operation of a parking place.

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Placing of traffic signs

The Council of the London Borough of Merton, having consulted the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended by section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985(b), Part 6 and Schedules 7 to 12 of the Traffic Management Act 2004(c) and of all other enabling powers hereby make the following Order:-

#### **PARTI**

#### **PRELIMINARY**

#### Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Merton (Free Parking Places) (Morden Road) Order 2021 and shall come into force on 7 June 2021.

#### Revocation

2. N/A.

## Interpretation

3. (1) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires:-

"civil enforcement officer" has the same meaning as in the Traffic Management Act 2004 and means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise and enforce the provisions of this Order:

"Council" means the Council of the London Borough of Merton;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meanings as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000(d);

"driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;

"electronic communications network" has the same meaning as in the Communications Act 2003(e).

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public, general or local, and includes any Order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment and any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment;

"goods carrying vehicle" means a motor vehicle which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description and is not drawing a trailer;

"motorcycle" has the same meaning as in section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

"parking place" means any area on a highway designated as a parking place by this Order;

"parking space" means a space in a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle;

"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle) constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of not more than twelve passengers (exclusive of the driver) and their effects and not drawing a trailer;

"penalty charge" has the same meaning as that given in section 92 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 in respect of a contravention of a provision to this Order;

"permitted hours" in relation to a parking place means the period specified at the beginning of the Schedule relating to that parking place;

"Schedule" means a Schedule to this Order;

"street" includes part of a street;

- (2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed as a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- (3) The prohibitions imposed by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any other enactment and any exception or exemption from the provisions of this Order is without prejudice to the provisions of any other enactment.

#### **PART II**

## **DESIGNATION OF PARKING PLACES**

## **Designation of parking places**

4. Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column 2 of a Schedule to this Order and, unless otherwise so specified, bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 2.0 metres is designated as a parking place.

## Number and situation of parking spaces

5. The number of parking spaces in each parking place referred to in column 2 of a Schedule to this Order shall not exceed the number specified in relation thereto in column 3 of that Schedule and the number and situation of such parking spaces in each parking place shall be as may be determined by the Council.

## Vehicles for which parking places are designated

6. Each parking place referred to in a Schedule to this Order may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, during the permitted hours for the leaving of passenger vehicles, goods vehicles, motor cycles and vehicles displaying a disabled person's badge.

#### PART III

#### SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS

## Period for which a vehicle may be left in a parking place

7. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be left in a parking place in a Schedule to this Order during the permitted hours for a continuous period longer than the maximum period of waiting specified in the heading to that Schedule and no person may cause or permit that same vehicle to return to that same parking place during the permitted hours, until the expiry of the minimum period specified in the heading to that Schedule of that parking place, beginning from the time it was driven away after the previous period of waiting in that same parking place.

## **Contraventions in parking places**

- 8. A contravention of this Order and a parking contravention within Part 1 of Schedule 7 to the Traffic Management Act 2004 shall occur and a penalty charge will be payable if:
  - (a) during the permitted hours, a vehicle is left in a parking place designated in a Schedule to this Order for a period longer than the maximum period of waiting specified in the heading to that Schedule; or
  - (b) during the permitted hours, the same vehicle is returned to the same parking place before the expiry of the minimum period specified in the heading to the Schedule to that parking place; or
  - (c) the vehicle is left parked in a manner that does not comply with that prescribed in Article 9.

## Manner of standing in a parking place

- 9. Every vehicle left in a parking place in accordance with the foregoing provisions of the Order shall so stand;
  - (a) in the case of a parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are specified in Column 4 of a Schedule to this Order, as to be in accordance with those provisions;
  - (b) in the case of any other parking place, if the parking place is not in a one-way street, that the left hand or near-side of the vehicle is adjacent to the left-hand edge of the carriageway;
  - (c) that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a parking place; and
  - (d) that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting.

For the purposes of the last foregoing sub-paragraph, the expression "premises" shall not include any premises to or from which goods are being delivered or collected.

# Power to suspend the use of a parking place

- 10. (1) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:
  - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
  - (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation adjacent to the parking place, the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to the parking place, the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any

- electronic communications network or the placing, maintenance of removal of any traffic sign;
- (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the parking place from or to a depository, another office of dwellinghouse;
- (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
- (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals, or on any other special occasions; or
- (f) for filming purposes.
- (2) A police constable in uniform may suspend for not more than seven days the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
- (3) On the suspension of the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Article, the person authorising or causing such suspension shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof, as the case may be, traffic signs indicating that the waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
- (4) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in a parking place or any part thereof at any time during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or that thereof, as the case may be, a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article:

Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall apply:

- (i) in respect of any vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 11(1)(b) or (d); or
- (ii) to anything done with the permission of the person suspending the use of the parking place or part thereof or a police constable in uniform or a police community support officer in uniform.

## Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in a parking place

- 11. (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours in any part of a parking place if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:
  - (a) the vehicle is waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes, or such longer period as a civil enforcement officer may approve, to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage:
    - provided that if the said person is a person suffering from any disability or injury which seriously impairs his ability to walk or who is blind, the vehicle may wait for as long as may be necessary to enable that person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage:
  - (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
  - (c) the vehicle is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes or is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers

- or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the parking place in which it is waiting;
- (d) the vehicle is waiting only for as long as may be necessary to enable it to be used on connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic.
- (2) Except as provided by this Order, the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a parking place.

## **Exemptions**

- 12. (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provision of this Order a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority may be left in a parking space without time limit, provided that the use of that part of the parking space in which the vehicle is left has not been suspended.
  - (2) A vehicle to which this Article applies shall stand in a parking space in accordance with the provisions of sub-paragraphs (a), (b) or (d) of Article 9 of this Order and wholly within the limits of that parking space.

## Movement of a vehicle in a parking place in an emergency

13. A police constable in uniform, a police community support officer in uniform, a traffic warden or a civil enforcement officer may move or cause to be moved, in case of emergency, to any place they think fit, any vehicle which is left unattended in a parking place.

## Alteration of position of a vehicle in a parking place

14. Where any vehicle is standing in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 9, a civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions.

## Removal of a vehicle from a parking place

15. Where a civil enforcement officer is of the opinion that any of the provisions contained in Article 9 have been contravened or not complied with in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place then he may remove or cause to be removed the vehicle from the parking place and, where it is so removed, shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle.

# Placing of traffic signs

## 16. The Council shall:

- (a) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place traffic signs and or carriageway markings of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised by the Department of Transport indicating that such parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the purpose and leaving only of the vehicles specified in Article 6 and for the period specified in Article 7; and
- (b) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purpose of the satisfactory operation of a parking place.
