I strongly oppose to another large shopping complex such as Westfield being located in Wimbledon. This is because the existing air pollution is posing a health risk to residents of Wimbledon and an increase in the level of air pollution would be bad for the health of the residents.

Instead, I feel it's better to have highrise, e. g. 30 storey, high-specification offices located just above the tracks on either side of the Wimbledon station, similar to the buildings above Victoria Station. Companies in the oil & gas sector would dearly love to have their offices in Wimbledon considering existing shopping facilities and the convenience of being just above Wimbledon station which has frequent trains to Waterloo with a travelling time of only 20 minutes. New adequate parking facilities would need to be provided underground under the Hartfield Crescent area.

Also, we need to integrate into the new developments new extensively landscaped gardens with tall trees and shrubs to make Wimbledon greener and with more cafes.
