



**LONDON BOROUGH OF MERTON**  
**EXPERIMENTAL SCHOOL SAFETY ZONE**

**THE MERTON (PRESCRIBED ROUTE) (IVY GARDENS) EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC ORDER 2020**

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the London Borough of Merton, on 14 October 2020, made the above mentioned Order under sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (therein after referred to as the Act), and all other enabling powers.
2. The general effect of the Order will be, further to changes to the afternoon student pick up times at the Harris Primary Academy, to:
  - (a) revoke the Merton (Prescribed Route) (Ivy Gardens) Experimental Traffic Order 2019; and
  - (b) prohibit any motorised vehicle entering the road listed in the Schedule to this notice, during the corresponding periods specified, with an exemption for those authorised vehicles which are specified on a white list for each road, held and maintained by the Council.
3. The Order has provided that in pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Council's Head of futureMerton or some person authorised in that behalf by him may, if it appears to him or that person essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic, or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Order runs, modify or suspend the Order or any provision thereof.
4. A copy of the Order, which will come into operation on 22 October 2020, of a plan of the relevant area and of the Council's statement of reasons for making the Order can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, until the Order ceases to have effect, at: Merton Link, Merton Civic Centre, London Road, Morden, SM4 5DX or viewed at: <https://www.merton.gov.uk/streets-parking-transport/traffic-management/consultations>.
5. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
6. The Council of the London Borough of Merton will consider in due course whether the provisions of the Order should be reproduced and continued in force indefinitely by means of an Order made under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Persons desiring to object to the making of the Order under section 6 of the said Act of 1984 for the purpose of such reproduction and continuation in force may, within a period of 6 months beginning with the day on which the experimental Order came into force, or if an experimental Order is varied by another Order or modified pursuant to section 10(2) of the said Act of 1984, within a period of 6 months beginning with the date on which the variation or modification or the latest variation or modification came into force, send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds thereof to the Head of futureMerton, Environment and Regeneration, Merton Civic Centre, London Road, Morden, SM4 5DX quoting reference:- **ES/Harris-Ivy-Gdns**.
