- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the London Borough of Merton, on 30 June 2021, made the above-mentioned Orders under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The Orders shall come into force on 9 July 2021 and continue in operation for a maximum period of 18 months.
- 3. The general effect of the Orders will be to remove parking bays at certain locations described in the Schedule to this notice to facilitate for the installation of parklets.
- 4. While the Orders remains in force, the Head of futureMerton or some person authorised in that behalf by him, may, under section 10(2) of the Act, if it appears to him or that person, essential in the interests of the convenient, expeditious, and safe movement of traffic; or in the interests of providing suitable and adequate on-street parking facilities or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Orders runs, modify or suspend the Orders or any provision thereof.
- 5. A copy of the Orders, and other documents giving more detailed particulars of the Orders, including plans identifying the lengths of road affected by the Orders, can normally be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive at Merton Link, Merton Civic Centre, London Road, Morden, Surrey, until the end of a period six months from the date on which the Orders come into force. However, due to the pandemic, documents are also available for inspection at https://www.merton.gov.uk/streets-parking-transport/traffic-management/consultations.
- 6. The London Borough of Merton, as the Order making authority, will consider in due course whether the provisions of the Orders should be continued in force indefinitely. Any person desiring to object to the Orders continuing indefinitely may, within a period of six months beginning with the day on which the experimental Orders came into force or if an Order is varied by another order or modified pursuant to section 10(2) of the 1984 Act, beginning with the day on which the variation or modification or the latest variation or modification came into force, visit https://www.merton.gov.uk/streets-parking-transport/traffic-management/consultations and do so at the appropriate feedback link, or write to the Environment and Regeneration Department at the Merton Civic Centre, London Road, Morden SM4 5DX quoting reference ES/PARKLETS and stating the grounds on which any such objection is made.
- 7. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Act, or that any of the relevant requirements of the Act, or of any relevant regulations made under that Act have not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, make an application for this purpose to the High Court.

STATEMENT OF REASONS

The above Orders are considered necessary to assist local businesses and support the economic recovery from COVID-19 restrictions. Parklets will also improve local amenities and contribute to improved air quality, vibrancy and sense of place as well as reducing vehicle dominance in the street scene.

The main reason for proceeding by way of Experimental Traffic Orders is to assess the effects of the proposals for a trial period before consideration is given to whether the provisions of the Experimental Traffic Orders should be made permanent.
