Following the statutory consultation that was carried out between 31 August and 22 September 2017 on the proposal to introduce Controlled Parking Zones (CPZs) in Christchurch Close and Colwood Gardens, I have agreed with the making of the relevant Traffic Management Orders (TMO) and the implementation of the following proposals:

- (i) a new CW4 CPZ to include Christchurch Close operational Monday to Friday 8.30am – 6.30pm and Saturday to Sunday 11am – 3pm as shown in Drawing No. Z78-342-03 attached in Appendix B
- (ii) a new CPZ CW5 to include Colwood Gardens operational Monday to Saturday 8.30am – 9pm (CW5) as shown in Drawing No. Z78-342-03 attached in Appendix B
- (iii) Exemption Order to allow footway parking in Christchurch Close to maximise the number of parking spaces.

Agree not to hold a public inquiry on the consultation process.
