## St James' Road and Framfield Road Traffic Calming Measures (Speed humps) Update

Notice of implementation February 2024

Dear Resident,

The purpose of this newsletter is to inform you that following the statutory consultation that was carried out between 31<sup>st</sup> August and 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2023, to introduce speed humps along St James' Road and Framfield Road, all the feedback received have been considered and a final decision has been made to proceed with the implementation of the proposed measures. The original plan indicated the road humps to be of a sinusoidal profile, however, this has since been changed to a round top profile.

We would like to thank all those who responded to the statutory consultation.

The works will be carried out between 19<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> February 2024, weather permitting, and every effort will be made to minimise any inconvenience the works may cause. Notice boards will be placed in advance of the works, advising all road users of these specific dates. The construction work will generally be carried out between the hours of 8am and 5pm. FM Conway Ltd will carry out the works on behalf of the Council.

## Traffic Management and Access Arrangements

To allow the works to be carried out as swiftly as possible, temporary parking restrictions will be introduced when and where necessary. "No Parking" cones and signs will be in place to indicate the areas where parking would be prohibited. By doing so, this will keep the roads free of parked vehicles allowing a smooth transition for the works. Offending vehicles run the risk of receiving a fine and possible removal. Notices and cones will be placed in your road 12-48 hours prior to work being undertaken.

Localised road closures will be in place at the location of each individual hump being constructed. Works will only be carried out in one road at a time to ensure access to properties is maintained via short diversions routes in place.

FM Conway Ltd will be able to update you on the progress as the works proceed. Please do not hesitate to ask the staff on site should you require any assistance. Merton Council and F M Conway Ltd apologise in advance for any inconvenience caused.
