Support in tough times

Foreword by Councillor Ross Garrod, Leader, London Borough of Merton:

My number one priority since becoming Leader of Merton Council last year has been to help residents through the current cost of living crisis with real, practical support. It has been a challenging time with high energy bills, high inflation, high mortgage rates and rents pushing up day-to-day costs. Too many people are struggling to make ends meet – and that’s simply not acceptable.

We acted quickly to help those most in need by setting up a £2 million Cost of Living Fund. This included targeted payments to those most in need; access to emergency grants, food and supermarket vouchers; as well as free school meals over the school holidays.

We have also given funding to support local foodbanks, provide debt advice services, and help for people to make their homes more energy efficient. Plus, our libraries opened as Warm Spaces, and now Cool Spaces, for people worried about using energy at home, providing activities, information, and support. In this booklet, you will find details of a wide range of support available locally.

With the backing of the Council, community organisations have come together to make sure help is available. Please take a look through and reach out if you need advice and support with the cost of living. These are difficult times for everyone, but you don’t need to face it alone.
