

Proposed Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) CH Mossville Gardens Area

Dear Resident/Business,

This leaflet is to update you of the outcome of the statutory consultation that was carried out between 9th May and 31st May 2019 on the proposals to introduce a Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) 'CH' (Cannon Hill) to include Arundel Avenue, Maycross Avenue, Mossville Gardens, Woodland Way and the section of Leamington Avenue between odd nos. 1 – 37 and even nos. 2 – 22 and the implementation of the 'At any time' waiting restrictions (double yellow lines).

The statutory consultation resulted in 17 representations to the proposal, which include 8 representations from properties within the proposed CPZ and 9 representations from properties outside the proposed zone. All the representations objected to the proposal. All representations received during the statutory consultation along with officer's recommendations were reported to the Cabinet Member for Member for Regeneration, Housing and Transport in August 2019. After careful consideration the following have been agreed:

- To proceed with the making of the relevant Traffic Management Orders (TMO) and the implementation of the proposed CH CPZ to include Arundel Avenue, Maycross Avenue, Mossville Gardens, Woodland Way and the section of Leamington Avenue between odd nos. 1 – 37 and even nos. 2 – 22, and operational Monday to Friday between 11am and 3pm.
- To proceed with the making of the relevant Traffic Management Orders (TMO) and the implementation of the 'At any time' waiting restrictions as shown in drawing overleaf.

What happens next

The final made TMO, which allows the restrictions to be implemented and administered, will be published in the London Gazette and the local newspaper shortly. Notices will also be placed on lamp columns in the affected areas. It is anticipated that the CPZ will come into operation on **11 November 2019**.

Dear Resident / Business

Following the Council's decision to introduce the CH CPZ Cannon Hill area, I am writing to inform you that the works will start on 28 October 2019, and will be carried out by F M Conway Ltd on behalf of the Council.

DATE AND TIME OF WORKS

The works including street cleansing are programmed to start the week commencing 28 October 2019 for a period of 5 days, weather permitting. Work will be carried out between 8am and 4.30pm. To allow the works to be carried out as quickly as possible, temporary parking restrictions will be introduced. "No Parking" cones and signs will be in place to indicate the areas where parking would be prohibited. By doing so, this will keep the roads free of parked vehicles allowing a smooth transition of the works. Vehicles would be allowed back into the road to park once the lining work is complete or after the working day. Offending vehicles run the risk of receiving a fine and possible relocation. Notices and cones will be placed in your road 12 – 48hrs prior to work being undertaken.

SCHEDULE OF WORKS: The work schedule of when your road will be marked is shown below.

Within the CPZ

- 1) Mossville Gardens and Maycross Avenue - 28 October. 2
- 2) Arundel Avenue and Woodland Way - 29 October
- 3) Leamington Avenue - 30 October.

Outside the CPZ

- 4) Leamington Avenue and Ashridge Way - 30 October.
- 5) Westcroft Gardens and Monkleigh Road - 31 October

The information on how to apply for your permit will follow shortly (roads within the CPZ only).

The Council is conscious of the inconvenience and the disruption that these works may cause and will endeavour to keep the impact to a minimum. We apologise in advance for any inconvenience that may be caused by these works.
