As a consultation document this was very difficult to access and disseminate. The quality and the scale of the images makes them difficult to read. The questionnaire/survey is made up of cross referencing making completing it very time consuming as well as frustrating. I found it so ponderous to fill in I have written this email.

Once into the document a great deal of the information was very compact which made it difficult to read and interpret. Our analysis of neighbour's knowledge of this consultation via two WhatsApp groups showed how few people knew of its existence.

Turning to the content particularly against the "infill" proposal, this shows the gulf between the requirement to preserve the green environment and the demands to erect more properties.

The intensification of the proposed housing density would dramatically degrade the local environment which is flying in the face of all the benefits to our mental and physical health of spending time in open green spaces. Merton Park is historically blessed with being designed to incorporate gardens and parks tree-lined roads of detached and semi-detached houses for which the area is known

There would be legitimate alarm about the demands on the following infrastructures

- Medical
- Educational
- Utilities
- Transport
- Parking

This would all add up to the detriment to the quality of the lives of men, women and children of Merton Park.

It should also be remembered that we are currently living through a time of change as many lives adapt to the Pandemic. Families are leaving London so it would be wise to postpone this consultation until normality resumes.
