Please take the time to read this letter which is aimed at introducing you to your waste collection service and where to find further information about this important service.


We have designed waste collection services to meet the demands for the wide array of properties we have in the borough. You will also be able to find further information of the correct waste & recycling containers you should have and how you can order containers that you may not have to recycle more and ensure your waste is contained responsibly.

YOUR collection day

To find your collection day, use the Collection Day checker at:

 merton.gov.uk/recycling

This will tell you when each of your bins and boxes are next due to be emptied.



We do ask residents to only present their waste on the scheduled day of collection by 6:00am on the edge of your property or where they can be easily accessed by our crews. Unless you have a bag collection service, please note that 'pavements are for people' and containers should remain on your property. Bulky Waste Items

The Council does provide a chargeable collection service for large waste items, such as furniture, mattresses and electrical white goods. We realise that your move may generate more waste than you normally produce and waste that won't normally be collected as part of the Council's waste service, so you can utilise this chargeable service as an effective and convenient way to dispose of your bulky waste items.
