TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER

2021 No. 81

The Merton (Prescribed Route) (Commonside East) (No. 2) Traffic Order 2021

Made: 26 October 2021

Coming into force: 8 November 2021

The London Borough of Merton, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended by section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985(b) and all other powers thereunto enabling hereby make the following Order: -

- 1. This Order shall come into force on 8 November 2021 and may be cited as the Merton (Prescribed Route) (Commonside East) (No. 2) Traffic Order 2021.
- 2. In this Order:-

"authorised vehicle" means a vehicle which is listed on the white list;

"pedal cycle" has the same meaning as in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016(c);

"prohibited area" means the area of carriageway in the London Borough of Merton which lies in Commonside East, from a point 2 metres south-east of point in line with the south-eastern kerb-line of Spencer Road south-eastward for a distance of 2 metres across the full width of the carriageway:

"traffic sign" has the same meaning as in section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

"white list" means a list of vehicles by reference to vehicle registration number, make and model held and maintained by the Council which are exempt from the prohibition specified in Article 3 to this Order.

3. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter the prohibited area.

- 4. Nothing in Article 3 of this the Order shall apply to:-
 - (a) a pedal cycle;
 - (b) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a police community support officer in uniform;
 - (c) any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway pursuant to section 66 or section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;
 - (d) any authorised vehicle.
- 5. The Merton (Prescribed Route) (Commonside East) Experimental Traffic Order 2020(d) is hereby revoked.
