Introduction

Climate Emergency:

Declaration of a Climate Emergency was approved at the July Council.

It committed to working towards:

A carbon neutral borough by 2050.

A carbon neutral Council by 2030

Setting up a **Climate Emergency Working Group** drawing on existing expertise within the borough as well as including representative residents.

Delivering an Action Plan to Cabinet in early 2020.





Action Plan: Phase 1

















Phase 1: Consult:

To produce a **sound evidence base** for each topic we aim to:

- Undertake a greenhouse gas inventory
- Identify the main measures that will achieve decarbonisation
- Estimate rate of decarbonisation needed to reach the targets

To gather a "long list" of **potential actions** we will:

- Seek wide participation through a public consultation
- Further thinking on complex actions with internal and external partners
- Identify opportunities internally to deliver through Council Activities



Action Plan: Phases 2 and 3

















Phase 2: Prioritise:

To begin to **form consensus** around the most important actions we will:

- Cross fertilize the evidence and ideas between groups
- Bring to the table the potential impacts, costs and benefits of key actions
- Consider where/ with whom the responsibility for actions lies
- Consider potential phasing (2020-2025, 2025-2030, 2040-2050)


Phase 3: Approve:

To finalise the Climate Action Plan we aim to:

- Seek Cabinet approval for the final action plan
