


Q1: Live, work, passing through?

Answered: 1,213 Skipped: 52




- Access to public transport,


- Poor quality condition and range of shops






Q9: Which of the following measures would be appropriate to make Morden town centre a more attractive and pedestrian and cycle friendly place?

Q10: Should existing parking for commuters become parking for local shopping needs, making shopping the top priority?



Q11: Why do you currently visit Morden town centre?



Q12: What would make you use Morden town centre more?






Other comments:

Bar/night clubs


Bars are supported but strong resistance to nightclubs

Morden Court Parade is a unique building which has been unsympathetically altered. We found an archive picture and think that the most dramatic visual improvement can be achieved by re-instating the original architecture of the facade. Concealed lights installed on the shop roofs can dramatically accentuate the elevation at night. Shopsigns need to be aligned with fascias, awnings integrated and where possible external roller shutters re-loccated. The historic
